THE NO-WATER TANGO: CLEANING YOUR CAR'S SAGGING ROOF

VACUUM WITH LOVE:

Start by gently vacuuming the sagging roof lining. Use a soft brush attachment to avoid turning a small problem into a "why is my roof now in my lap?" situation. This removes dust and gives you a clearer idea of what you're dealing with.



STICKY BUSINESS:

For areas where the fabric isn't too rebellious, a bit of spray special adhesive can do wonders. Remember, we're doing precision work here – think of it as performing surgery on a grape. You don't want adhesive everywhere like it's a kindergarten art project. Do not use normal glue as it will not work for the car roof.



CLEAN SWEEP:

To clean the surface, gently wipe with a microfiber cloth slightly dampened with a mixture of water and a mild fabric cleaner. Emphasis on "slightly"; we're not trying to give the roof a bath. It's more like a refreshing mist on a hot day – rejuvenating but not drenching.


